



* Navigation controls are transparent, becoming fully visible when you hover over them (top left corner).

Tip! Pan is the active tool by default. Use the mouse scroll wheel to zoom in or out quickly.

* As you access widgets, windows will open at the right side of the map. If you choose not to close a widget when finished with the tool, you may end up with several windows blocking your map or the required window may no longer be visible. Click the arrows to shift the position of open windows. Use the double arrow to hide or display all windows.

* Click a map base button to switch between aerial photography and the streets base.

WIDGETS:

Bookmarks: Want to save the map extents of a project or site so you can quickly zoom back? Add a bookmark - this will be retained in the Bookmark list until you remove it by clicking the red 'x' beside the name.

Draw and Measure: Add text or graphics to customize your map. Control size, style, colour and opacity of your markups. Simply select the appropriate tool, adjust settings and click on the map where you would like the object to appear. Select a tool again to continue adding markups. Save your markups for reuse on another map. Clear your markups individually by right-clicking on them, or use the Clear All button.

Tip! Hold the mouse button down when drawing freehand lines or polygons, or when setting the size of a circle or ellipse (moving out from the centroid). Double-click to complete lines or polygons.

Google Street View: View and navigate street-level imagery from Google by clicking the icon in the widget window (to activate the tool). Click the area of interest on the map and Google street view will appear at the bottom of the map window. Close street view with the 'x' button on the widget window.

Print: Print a hardcopy or save your map as a jpg from the Preview that is generated with this tool. The area you see on the screen may differ slightly to accommodate the print size you pick from the available dropdown.

Legend: Access the legend and details about the map layers (metadata) with this tool. Click the Information button beside a layer to view the layer details.

Search: Search for addresses, intersections, or directly on a layer.

Find An Address: Use this search when you know the street number and name. Enter the information as prompted, using a suffix if known (e.g. St) and municipality. A bullseye will mark results on the map and potential matches are returned in the widget result window (click a record to zoom to it). Search another address with the Address Search.

Find An Intersection: Enter two intersecting road names separated by an "&" and use a suffix if known (e.g. Rd). Results will display as they do for addresses.

Search Layers: Use a graphical search to find a feature or search by keyword. Information from multiple layers will be returned, some with hyperlinks.

Buffer: Select objects within a specified distance of a point or other graphic you add to the map. Save the resulting list to csv, or click the Buffer by Graphic button to make a different selection.

Tip! Double-click a record to zoom to it and single-click to temporarily highlight it on the map. Buffer will disappear when you close the widget.

Identify: Select this tool to return information about layers at or within the graphic you draw.

Tip! Some records have hyperlinks you can click.

Measure: Return the length of a line, or area of a polygon/circle.
