REGIONAL CHAIR'S REMARKS

130. Regional Chair Partington advised Regional Council that since Council first reconvened Council in January, they have undertaken a lot of activity in support of our Council Business Plan and in establishing the direction Council will take in this their final year of their term of office.

The Regional Chair noted that Niagara is beginning to see a light at the end of the recessionary tunnel that has affected our economy and our citizens in the past year. The recovery is being assisted by the substantial investments in our various infrastructure projects. Many significant building projects are either near completion or actively underway.

The Regional Chair along with staff travelled to Ottawa earlier this year to meet with Transport Minister John Baird to discuss the proposed Wastewater Treatment Plant for Niagara-on-the-Lake, and the urgent need to replace the Burgoyne Bridge in St. Catharines. We're also working to secure provincial support for the Burgoyne Bridge project. The Regional Chair has sent a letter to the Ontario Minister of Energy and Infrastructure, Brad Duguid, regarding the project and have requested a meeting to discuss the significance of this project and Niagara's desire to proceed as quickly as possible.

Niagara's success in initiating a number of infrastructure projects during the course of this term are in large part due to our efforts in working collaboratively and proactively with our stakeholders and government partners. Simply put, our strategy works, and we believe that if we continue with this advocacy approach, we will secure many more good things for Niagara which are important to our future.

Last month the Regional Chair was requested to appear as a panelist at the FCM Sustainable Communities Conference about an issue Regional Council knows is of great interest to him – protecting the shorelines of our Great Lakes. The focus of the Chair's presentation was to outline the Niagara Water Strategy and the role Niagara Region is playing along with the City of Hamilton and Haldimand County to address the growing concerns about our common watershed resources – Lake Ontario and Lake Erie.

The Niagara Water Strategy provides Regional Council with a vision that will help guide our actions over the next 30 years in how we manage these resources from an economic, environmental and social perspective. The Regional Chair also used this forum to champion the work that we as a Council will be undertaking with our Lakefront Enhancement Strategy aimed at providing greater public access to our waterfronts.

While at the conference the Regional Chair also had the opportunity to meet with Stephen Kelly – Chief of Staff to federal Environment Minister Jim Prentice. Regional Chair Partington discussed with Mr. Kelly the importance of the Government of Canada renewing its commitment to the restoration of the Great Lakes, especially with a newly heightened interest in the issue by the United States under the Obama administration.

Renegotiation of the Canada-US Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement for the first time in nearly 25 years would not only enhance Niagara's water initiatives, but local, national, and bi-national relationships as well.

Niagara's relationship with our American neighbours is an important one. It fosters partnerships in business, education and various other organizations and initiatives. Last week, the Regional Chair returned from Albany where he attended an event hosted by the Consul General of Canada called Canada Day. Its aim was to raise Canada's profile among New York's key policy makers. Initiatives like this help to create social and economic opportunities that will shape our future, and he was pleased to participate in this worthwhile event.

Another one of Council's priorities for 2010 is the recognition of Niagara as a strategic economic gateway and border crossing by the federal government. Recognition by the federal government will be vital to our continuing efforts to create jobs and encourage industry growth for our communities. We will also be making efforts to secure the province's support on this important initiative.

The Regional Chair was pleased to advise Regional Council that Niagara Week at Queen's Park has been tentatively scheduled for May 10, 11 and 12. The event will take on an added significance this year in light of the recent cabinet shuffles - both at Queen's Park and on Parliament Hill.

Of particular interest to us is the move of St. Catharines MPP Jim Bradley from the Ministry of Transportation to Municipal Affairs and Housing. Minister Bradley has been very helpful in advocating for the Region at Queen's Park and we wish him well as he settles into his new cabinet responsibilities.

Much work is being done by local communities on both sides of the border in preparation of the 200th anniversary of the War of 1812. We in particular have been active on the bi-national 1812 Bicentennial Legacy Council, which has been busy planning a series of events that will be occurring here and across the border leading up to 2012.

One of the Legacy Council's recent projects, a commemorative map identifying various trails and battlefields of the War of 1812, was presented to Ontario Lieutenant Governor, the Honourable David C. Onley, at an appreciation ceremony held recently at Queen's Park in honour of the Legacy Council. Regional Chair Partington thanked all of those involved with the Legacy Council, in particular Vincent Del Bouno, for all of their hard work so far in promoting Niagara's rich history.

Planning for our 40th anniversary events is continuing, and the Regional Chair was pleased to advise Regional Council of the Anniversary Gala Dinner being held on May 6 at the Hilton Hotel in Niagara Falls. Regional Chair Partington is looking forward to seeing you there. The Regional Chair acknowledged the Councillors on the various 40th anniversary planning committees and the hard work that is being accomplished, and for volunteering their efforts and time to ensure our 40 years of success as a Region are appropriately celebrated.

Many of you have seen the tremendous display of photographs in the atrium here at Regional headquarters. These photos – 300 of them – were made and submitted by Niagara residents as part of the “My Niagara” photo contest held by the Region. An awards ceremony was held recently to recognize the winners. If you haven’t done so already, take a few minutes to visit this beautiful display of images of Niagara, which will be up until the end of the month.

The Regional Chair on behalf of Regional Council thanked Peter Van Beurden from Westland Greenhouses (Jordan) Ltd. of Jordan Station for the flowers that adorned the Council Chamber. These flowers will be donated to Upper Canada Lodge in Niagara-on-the-Lake.

- 2) That the fixed water requisitions for the area municipalities be established as follows:
 - a) That \$10,504,571, representing 25% of Regional 2010 water costs, be apportioned to each area municipality based on their three year average proportionate share of the Region's three year average total water flows;
 - b) That the apportionments of recommendation A) 2)a) be requisitioned to the area municipalities as contained in Schedule A of this report in twelve equal monthly billings effective March 1, 2010;
 - 3) That the Regional water treatment budget of \$44,541,100 gross and \$42,018,284 net be approved, representing an increase of 1.7% in the operating budget and an overall net 3% increase to the water requisitions.
- B) Wastewater System
- 1) That the 2010 Regional wastewater treatment costs be apportioned to the area municipalities based on their three year average proportionate share of the Region's three year average total wastewater flows;
 - a) That the wastewater requisitions for the area municipalities be established as contained in Schedule B of this report;
 - b) That the apportionments identified in recommendation B) 1)a) be requisitioned to the area municipalities in twelve equal monthly billings effective March 1, 2010;
 - c) That the Regional wastewater treatment budget of \$61,391,169 gross and \$59,391,038 net be approved, representing an increase of 1.7% in the operating budget and an overall net 3% increase to the wastewater requisitions.
