

Re: Private Sector Remediation Under the Region of Niagara Combined Sewer Overflow Funding Policy

Please be advised that, at its meeting of November 28, 2011, the Council of The Corporation of the City of Port Colborne resolved as follows:

Whereas the City of Port Colborne has partnered with the Region of Niagara since 2008 to eliminate Combined Sewer Overflows in this Municipality;

Whereas the elimination of extraneous flows at all sources defers Regional and Local Capital Funding costs for infrastructure upgrades and provides additional capacity for new development in Urban Areas;

Whereas current studies and initiatives on source control in Port Colborne provide clear evidence that a major source of extraneous flow originates from the private sector (sump pump connections);

Whereas the Region of Niagara has amended the conditions for eligibility for the Combined Sewer Overflow Funding Program in 2008 to exclude any funding for private sector remediation.

Now therefore the Council of The Corporation of the City of Port Colborne resolves as follows:

That the Region of Niagara reconsider the Combined Sewer Overflow Funding Policy to include remediation of all sources of extraneous flows within the designated areas of study, on a case by case basis.

That the Regional Municipality of Niagara be so notified.
