



Think and Drive TVCOGECO Niagara Challenge Game



What is it?

The TVCOGECO Niagara Challenge game is a new feature of the Think and Drive road safety educational program (see www.thinkanddrive.net). It is designed to entertain while educating people about the road safety topics that are important in Niagara.

Who can play?

- Drivers
- Pedestrians
- Adults
- Passengers
- Cyclists
- Teens

Why play the game?

The game will teach road users about important Niagara road safety topics, make them aware of risks, help them look at their own driving habits and teach them how to drive more safely.

Where can it be played?

- community events
- service or social club meetings
- health and safety committee meetings
- classrooms
- workplace meetings
- health fairs
- church meetings

How is it played?

The game is made up of a simple instruction sheet, a title panel and a set of 20 question and answer game cards. It can be played by individuals or teams.

The game requires one person to act as the host or presenter. The host selects one game card at a time, allowing participants to guess the correct answer. Once players have had a chance to give their answers, the host flips the game card over to reveal the correct answer. Play continues through all the cards or until the time allowed for play runs out.

The game is also available in PowerPoint presentation format for easy use at a meeting or presentation.
