- 3. Reconfiguration for road accesses at Great Western St., Permilla St. Ambrose St. and Cameron Park

- 5. New street from Ridley Road to station site.
- 6. Geometric improvements at Pelham Rd.
- 7. Potential realignment of Ridley Rd.




RIDLEY ROAD

- Louth Street EA is active
- PIC #2 expected May 2023
- Examines intersection of Ridley Road / Louth Street
- Determining if/where a grade separation might be warranted along multiple north/south options





2. Future State—Ridley Road




- Design is ongoing expected completion late summer 2023
- Covers Henrietta
 Street to Louth Street
- Construction proposed to begin early 2024





3. Future State—Station Site



- Region acquired CN lands and VIA station
- New: 6 bay bus loop
- New: 140+ parking spaces
- New: primary station access road

- Preserving heritage station
- Site Plan approval pending
- Approval targeted for late summer 2023
- Construction begin summer 2024





4. Current State-St. Paul Street Bridge














4. Future State—St. Paul Street Bridge



- Closure of bridge last half of 2023
- Signed detour route will be St. Paul St. → Pelham Rd. → Louth St.
- Bridge construction anticipated late 2023





WHAT TO EXPECT: Bridge Closure

Transit in the Area

- Niagara Region Transit (NRT):
 - Routes 315/415 will not run across St. Paul Street
 - NRT moving to on-demand service for West St. Catharines once bridge closure occurs
 - Will utilize existing bus stops as pickup
- GO Transit (Route 18K):
 - We will continue to work closely with our partners at Metrolinx to find an appropriate alternative location for GO Transit service during construction





WHAT TO EXPECT: Bridge Closure

Traffic Mitigation

- Formalized detour routing away from neighbourhood
- Large trucks diverting to arterial roads
- Addition of new proposed speed humps
- Partial road closures on selected streets
- No buses on side streets (Ridley neighbourhood)





Signed Detour Route

- Signed detour
 route will be Louth
 → Pelham → St.
 Paul
- Will be in place when bridge is closed




 Addition of new potential partial road closures -"local traffic only"
